# Children's Summer Reading Program JUNE 17 - JULY 29

This year's Summer Reading Program is going to be worlds of fun. Join your friends at the library to work together to Build a Better World this summer! The construction theme will help kids "gear up" to reach their reading goal. Registration begins at the world-class kickoff event on *Saturday*, *June 17* and registration continues through *Saturday*, *July 8*.

The program allows children from birth to 5<sup>th</sup> grade to create their own personal goal for the number of days they plan to read (between 20 and 40). Readers and pre-readers will learn more about the world as they track their success on a world map. 
May Erlewine August 17
