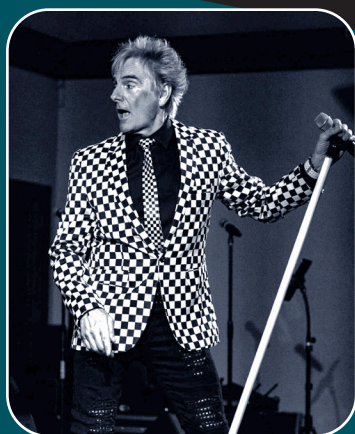


LYRICS ON THE LAWN

The Otsego District Library is grateful to receive a \$10,000 Molina Healthcare grant to support expanded services for local seniors.

Funding from the grant will help provide senior-focused programs, such as Coffee and Conversations, creating opportunities for social connection, learning, and community engagement.

The grant will also assist in launching a new homebound delivery service beginning in late summer/early fall, helping deliver library materials and resources directly to patron doorsteps - specifically targeting homebound senior patrons. 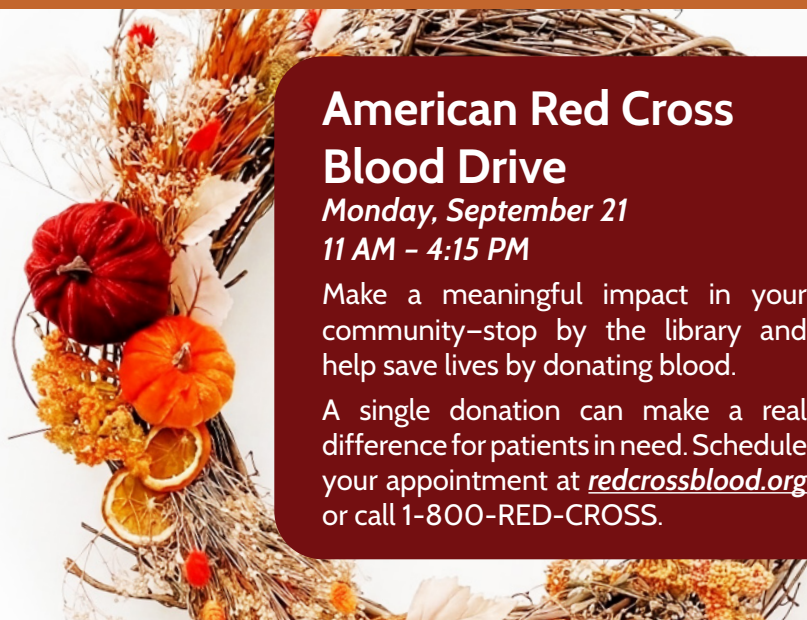

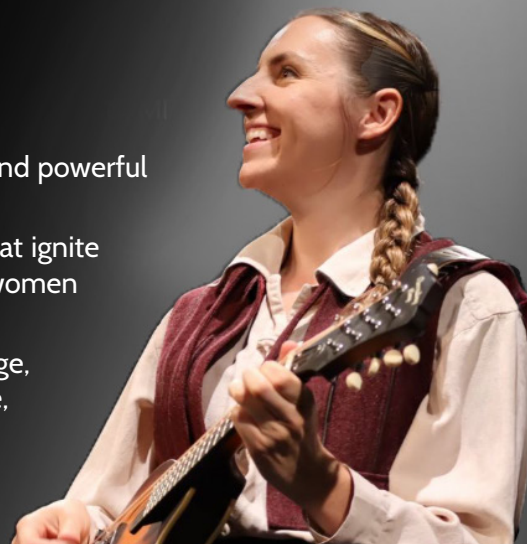

AUGUST 4, 2026 BALLOT PROPOSAL

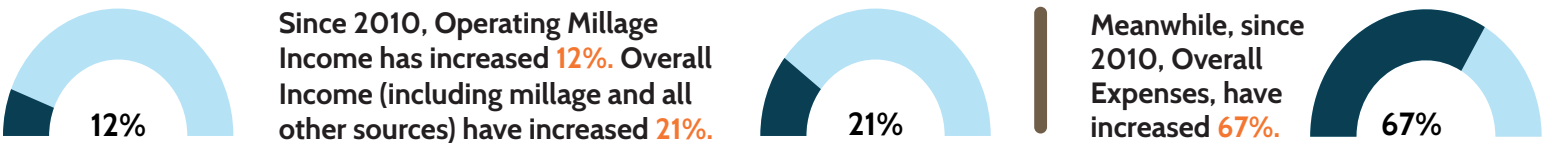


Since Last Operating Millage Ask. Operating on 1 Mill voted in 1996. (now at 0.9502 due to headlee rollback)

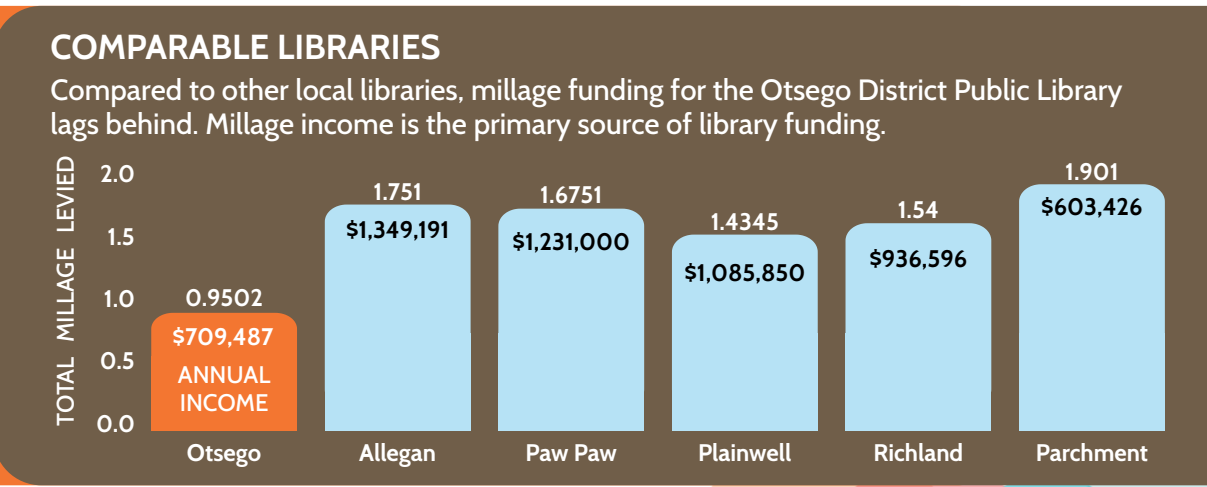
In 1996, min wage was \$3.35/hr - 7000 ft² facility.
In 2027, min wage will be \$15/hr - now 18,400 ft² facility.

- DEBT MILLAGE COMPLETE IN MAY 2027 - LAST LEVY**
 - The library's construction bonds will be paid off in May 2027, and the levy for approximately 0.5 mill will be dropped from tax roll.
- REFINANCED BONDS TO SAVE TAXPAYER DOLLARS**
 - In 2016, the library refinanced its building's debt bonds, SAVING TAXPAYERS OVER 1.5 MILLION 2016 - 2026.
- RISING EXPENSES ARE OUTPACING OPERATING INCOME**
 - In particular, rising costs for building & equipment maintenance, along with increased staffing expenses due to increasing minimum wage rates, are outpacing income.
- FUND BALANCE DEPLETION**
 - The library has had to rely heavily on its fund balance to cover both upgrades and routine maintenance as well as regular operating costs.

INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS: OUR FACILITY IS 17 YEARS OLD
The library has over \$500,000 in known infrastructure repair & essential maintenance needs, including HVAC, crumbling exterior masonry, lighting, parking lot maintenance, and accessibility improvements.

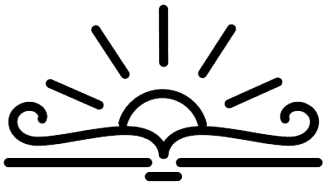


Community Forums: Otsego District Public Library

Friends of the Library

The Friends of the Library have made a strong impact this year thanks to community support and dedicated volunteers. The Spring Book Sale raised \$1,218, with volunteers handling setup, sales, and cleanup. The Friends' donated \$4,000 for Read & Dine: Adult Winter Reading Club, new tables, library grounds updates, and historic map restoration. An additional \$4,000 gift to the Friends from the Evergreen Foundation will fund children's books for the Summer Reading Program, Easy Reader books, and Large Print titles.

Community donations continue to enrich both the Friends Book Store and the library collection, including a recent large paperback donation currently being processed, with nearly 800 books added to the library collection this year - with more to come!

Volunteer opportunities remain available throughout the year, including Summer Reading, Lyrics on the Lawn, and Book Store shifts. New volunteers are always welcome.
